# dementia friendly communities

## 5 simple steps to maximize your brain health

Step 1: Look after your heart.

Did you know that what's good for the heart is good for the brain? Having high blood pressure, high cholesterol, type 2 diabetes, being obese, and smoking all increase the risk of developing dementia. Promisingly, research suggests that treatment of mid-life high blood pressure has been found to reduce dementia risk. Treatment of high cholesterol, diabetes and obesity is necessary for good brain health. Quitting smoking has also shown to be protective against dementia. So it's important to have regular health checks, seek help on quitting smoking, and follow the advice of your doctor.

Step 2: Do some kind of physical activity

Regular physical activity is associated with better brain function and reduced risk of dementia. To put it simply, being physically active gives our brains a healthy boost. Physical activity increases blood flow to the brain, stimulates the growth of brain cells and connections between them, and is associated with larger brain volume! Follow Australia's Physical Activity and Sedentary Behaviour Guidelines by being active on most, but preferably all, days of the week. Accumulate 2.5 to 5 hours of moderate physical activity each week; and include muscle strengthening activities, such as lifting weights, at least 2 days a week.

Step 3: Mentally challenge your brain

Being mentally active throughout your life is important for brain health. Challenging the brain with new activities helps to build new brain cells and strengthen connections between them. Mentally challenging your brain can protect against dementia. The key is to always learn new things. It could be learning a new language, taking up a new sport or learning a new hobby. Challenge yourself often and keep learning new things throughout life.

Step 4: Follow a healthy diet

Evidence suggests that a healthy, balanced diet may help in maintaining brain health and functionality. Studies indicate that a diet high in saturated and transunsaturated fats (meat, deep fried food, takeaway food, pies, pastries, etc) are associated with an increased risk of dementia. Evidence suggests that a diet that includes a higher intake of polyunsaturated and monounsaturated fats (e.g. olive oil and fish oil), foods high in antioxidants (e.g. tomatoes, pinto and kidney beans, oranges) are beneficial to brain health. We recommend following the Australian Dietary Guidelines by eating vegetables, fruit ,fish, grains, nuts, legumes and lean meat, and reducing the intake of saturated fats.

Step 5: Enjoy social activity

Being socially engaged is good for our wellbeing and brain health. It not only helps to keep us connected with the world around us, but also stimulates our brain. To help look after your brain health it's important to be social with people whose company you enjoy and in ways that interest you. Research has found that social activities that involve mental activity and physical activity, such as dancing or table tennis for example, provide even greater benefit for brain health and reducing the risk of dementia.



From the Mayor's Desk



The recent storm in Millmerran whilst very intense showed the current storm drainage system did not cope in the circumstances and there is a need for our senior drainage staff to look at how we can manage future storms of this magnitude. It is not the first time the system has not coped and I am hoping we can get a review undertaken. The rain in recent weeks has certainly been of tremendous benefit to the whole region but there have been many similar events right across the whole area that are concerning. There were a number of houses in close proximity to Toowoomba that suffered in the particularly intense rain events we've experienced. At the time of preparing I have not been able to get our senior staff out there but hopefully we can work out a way of improving things.

Despite all of this, the rain has been a wonderful blessing with plenty of greenery and dams full or much better than they were. While the drought is far from over, the impact of that terrible dry spell lingers on and the financial and mental impact will hang around for a long time. We hope and pray that after such a difficult time we can see a period of better seasons in the coming month and years. The Australian climate has a bad habit of producing tremendous variation and I guess we've seen a good example of just that in recent years.

One of the sporting highlights of the year, especially for golfers, is the annual Coca Cola Qld PGA Golf Tournament held at the City Golf Club in South Street Toowoomba each February. It is a popular tournament and draws golfers from all over Australia and internationally. Many emerging players have taken part and have gone on to greater levels in the sport. It has been running now in Toowoomba for eleven years and it is hopeful that we are going to retain it well into the future. Golf is an important pastime for many people in our community and many small communities such as ours are fortunate to have a good quality course. Part of the reason for TRC's support of the event is to further promote sport in our community, and this year, with the coverage by Fox Sport on national TV, serious promotion of our broader community particularly from a tourism prospective has been wonderful. It was really amazing how many people I ran into who came from the regional areas particularly Millmerran.

You may have noted recently that the State Government, without any consultation with our council, announced that they would use our water supply system, which includes significant very expensive infrastructure to provide water to Warwick. It was an unfortunate non inclusive process and despite them getting a lot of information from our staff there was no discussion with our CEO or myself. Our Premier did eventually come to town for a discussion and we were able to settle things down considerably but certainly not completely. They have undertaken to consult more widely with us in the future in the process and work with us to get a better understanding of the impact on us. Water is a precious commodity and the rate payers need to understand the impact of the State Government plan. The Wivenhoe pipeline cost \$200 million and although the State Government of the day contributed over \$100million, the pipeline and the distribution system is still our asset. Anyhow the Premier and her staff are now, following the discussion, thinking of a water grid that includes Toowoomba, Warwick and all places in between. A connection to the Clarence River could also provide additional water for agriculture. It is going to be an interesting journey. The other good news is that recent rain has given Warwick an additional two years of water.

Fires in the rest of Australia particularly NSW and Victoria certainly overshadowed the difficulties in this area and I guess for that very reason it was difficult to get support from organisations such as "Blaze Aid" to our area. I do hope that we can learn from what happened and take the opportunity to reduce fire hazard at the appropriate time of the year. We are hoping to bring the local volunteer bush fire brigades together to develop a local plan to do just that. I was reading an article regarding the dangers posed by highways and the number of fires they start in the USA. Maybe that could be part of our local consideration. Our wonderful volunteers would be best used reducing hazard during the safe fire period rather than risking their lives in difficult times. You will no doubt hear more as the year progresses.

The latest news to me has indicted that DD Health is providing a good service in our community while we wait to see what the future holds. We all hope we can return to where we used to be for all those years with our own privately operated medical centre. It has been a difficult and divisive journey but a medical centre covering as many of the local needs is what every community needs. In saying that, the service level in Toowoomba in health is good and plans are for it to continually improve. A lot of work is being done in an effort to bring a wider range of skills to the area. I recently spoke at the 30th anniversary of Smithy's Gym where a big effort is going into getting a neurosurgeon to establish in town. Brendan and his wife lost their son following a brain injury in a boxing match and of course we lost the Deputy Mayor's husband Roger Taylor following a fall which caused brain injury. Timely surgical intervention is vital if these injuries are to be dealt with.

Finally, lets hope the recent rains are the beginning of a good productive season for all of us. We must remember how difficult it has been for people closely involved in farming, and the long term effect on the income and the mental health of all those people closely involved be it as a farmer or associated dependent businesses.

## Yallambee News

Well I did say last month that February **may** be the last edition of Yallambee News and I left the door open for a **final wind up of news from Yallambee Aged Care**. Brace yourselves however because Millmerran Centenary Retirement Village Inc lives on until that association is wound up by the financial members. I guess I will be reporting on that as it evolves. So here I am back again with some more of 'it'. On 3 March 2020 Maclean Care Limited (MCL) will formally take over the operation of our local aged care facility. You will note that I say 'operation'. This is important because under the Constitutions of both Millmerran Centenary Retirement Village Inc (MCRV) and MCL, the assets of the facility can never be sold for gain by any individual or by any organisation unless the profits of such a sale are applied to a similar purpose. In the absence of some diabolical change in legislation or circumstances our local aged care facility will continue to operate and cater for the elderly in our community as it always has, hopefully even better and with less 'bumps and bruises'.

No chance of an overrun this month and I'll try to avoid too much sadness and melancholy. And no foreboding either although we, and MCL, have always been upfront about the possibility of changes. MCL will put their own stamp on Yallambee Aged Care and it stands to reason that they will make operational adjustments. But they have a very good past record with the regulation and compliance agencies and like all providers, they will fall under the new regime that stems from the Aged Care Royal Commission. That is one thing that the retiring Board of Management did not believe they, or future Boards made up of local community members would be able to navigate without significant stress. It would also almost certainly require a substantial outlay on an additional senior staff member in the form of a professional compliance officer.

Last month I paid a special tribute to our **staff**. It has occurred to me since then that too many long good-byes, thanks and tributes might indicate that all Yallambee Aged Care **contributors**, **volunteers and supporters** are a thing of the past. Not so. **All will be just as important and just as valuable to the aged care facility in Millmerran and to its residents**. <u>It's about the residents</u> The residents and their families are the beneficiaries of good management, good care and a supportive and involved community. Maclean Care will need and value our local community support just as much as MCRV Inc did for 35 years.

With that said, on behalf of all the Boards of Management of MCRV Inc who have gone before me, I offer heartfelt thanks to our wonderful Ladies Auxiliary, our tireless Bargain Boutique team, our sponsors, donors and volunteers and all who have contributed to the first life of Yallambee Aged Care. Many have been on the journey for the entire 40 years. Many have come and gone. The job however goes on. Where is the next wave? Something for all in our community to consider. One day we will all need aged care. Become involved, have a say, lend a hand.

As we wind down now to the transition of local control and operation of Yallambee Aged Care I would like to take this opportunity to thank the Millmerran community for their unwavering support during the difficult times we experienced over the last few years. Most people were able to see beyond the headlines and sensations and anyone who took the time or interest to visit Yallambee could very quickly see that our aged care facility was a modern, safe and happy home for our elderly residents. Thank you for disseminating the facts and making informed judgement. We have never shied away from the fact that some management decisions have disaffected some people and some staff performances and behaviours have also at times created problems and failings. There was 'pain' along the way but also undeniable 'gain'. We hand over Yallambee Aged Care with safe and happy residents, wonderful staff, financially viable and fully accredited. I will always wish that there had been an easier road to this very satisfying destination.

Much work is being done to restore a long term, fully resourced and integrated medical service to Millmerran. It will benefit Yallambee Aged Care and the entire community. QH/DDHHS are working tirelessly behind the scenes to make this happen. I have been part of a group of stakeholders in this process and I can assure you of the genuine best efforts of the DDHHS team in this regard. They are looking at various models including private providers, public health and joint ventures. There are many unanswered questions in this story that only a few are privy to and there is misdirected blame. In the fullness of time I hope that the end result is clarity on many issues. Some of this clarity may be uncomfortable for many of you.

The rain is the good news. People are apparently presenting at optometrists with eye problems. The sudden shock of green is causing adjustment disorders in their ophthalmic nerves. And 'pig-weed rage'. Remember though 'one swallow does not a summer make'. Lots more needed. 'Send 'er down huey'. Young people won't get either of those.

So that's it. If I was full of 'it' I'm now empty. And duly flushed. No more Yallambee Aged Care News from me.

I've been thinking lately about grace and, when I think about grace, the first verse that comes to mind is 2 Corinthians 12:9 where God said to Paul, My grace is sufficient for you...

Paul was being persecuted by Satan and experiencing numerous troubles and trials as a result, that tried to wear him down so he'd give up sharing the good news of Jesus Christ. Those trials and troubles included being imprisoned, stoned, beaten, shipwrecked and attacked by angry mobs (2 Corinthians 11).

Three times Paul asked the Lord, Take this from me! And each time God responded, My grace is sufficient for you... We hear that and think God is saying, You're just going to have to put up with it, Paul. That's not what God is saying at all. Paul was asking God to remove Satan's persecution from him.

I always wondered why God wouldn't or couldn't just remove the persecution Paul was experiencing. As I searched the Scriptures, I saw it's because we're not redeemed from persecution. God in Jesus redeemed us from sin, sickness and poverty but not persecution. How do I know? 2 Timothy 3:12 anyone who belongs to Christ Jesus and wants to live right will have persecution from others.

When God said to Paul, My grace is sufficient for you, He was letting Paul know he was empowering Him to take command over Satan's attacks. He was saying to Paul, Trust in, have faith in, the love I have for you. It is enough to strengthen you to withstand whatever attacks come.

We're not required to have anything but faith and trust in God's incredible and unconditional love for us. We're told in 1 John 4:10 perfect love...or the love God loves you with ... casts out fear. What kind of fear? Well, in this case, the fear we won't win over persecution, over what we're facing.

If you're feeling overloaded and stressed out with so much going on in your life that you feel like you can't keep up, God wants to enlarge your capacity to handle the stress of daily living while giving you peace and comfort. He said in 2 Corinthians 12:9 My grace is sufficient for you... That word sufficient means an overwhelming provision. God gives us what we need to deal with the problem ... not to avoid it.

Knowing God's grace is sufficient for us to win over what life brings means we can have a bold confidence to take on life. When we have used our faith to stand against persecution or pressure, we don't run from it in fear but stand in confidence in God's faithfulness, in His grace, in His power, knowing it is sufficient.

ABEL BROTHER BROUGHT CAIN COUNTENANCE FALLEN FAT FIELD FELL FIRSTLINGS FLOCK FRUIT GROUND MAN OFFERING SHEEP SIN SLEW TILLER WROTH WELL

Here we read about the first family. As the first parents, Adam and Eve have two sons. The first-born son was called Cain, and the second-born son was called Abel.

Abel became a shepherd, and took care of sheep, while Cain became a farmer and took care of growing crops and working the ground. One day when it came time for them to offer their best to the LORD, they both brought a gift to sacrifice on the altar. Abel brought a healthy young lamb, but Cain just brought some fruit that he had grown. This offering from Abel was worth a lot, and meant more to God because this was a life. The life of a healthy young sheep that could have grown and been a good healthy sheep for many years. Cain's offering didn't cost Cain much at all, and God wasn't pleased with this offering. A sacrifice must cost something to be a true sacrifice, and the cost of Cain's sacrifice was very small compared to Abel's. When God told Cain that his sacrifice wasn't enough, Cain got angry, instead of being humble and admitting that he had done the wrong thing. He was angry at God and angry at his brother, instead of thinking about the wrong type of offering he had brought. God speaks to Cain and asks him why he is so angry on the inside and looking so angry on the outside. The word "countenance" means our face. Just by looking at Cains face, God could tell that Cain was angry from his expression. God gives Cain a warning, and with that an opportunity to change his attitude. Cain had to make the decision to stay angry, causing hate toward his brother, or stop himself from feeling this way and choose to fix what he had done wrong. Cain could have said sorry to God, sorry to his brother and offered his best to the Lord instead of what he had plenty of. Sadly, Cain ended up staying angry, and one day that anger got so bad and the hatred of his brother so strong, that he killed Abel. Abel had done nothing wrong toward Cain. It was just the jealousy, hatred and bitterness that caused Cain to do this. This is a very sad story, and Cain now becomes the first murderer

because he held on to his anger and would not show love. We need to be careful where our anger can lead us. It is far better to forgive, and do right, then to allow ourselves to do more wrong. 1 John 3:11-12 KJV "For this is the message that ye heard from the beginning, that we should love one another. Not as Cain, who was of that wicked one, and slew his brother..."

# Do things get too hard for you?

Many people go through tough times. Just living life can sometimes be a chore, and some days we can feel like we are getting nowhere, and <u>then</u> an issue arises, or a difficulty lands in our path. In Millmerran alone, we have faced fires and floods, and droughts and deluges, just in the last 3 months. Depending on our everyday situation, these things can be challenging. They can make people feel like "what's next", or that things are "too hard". These verses above are good to remember during such times. Sometimes God will allow some tough times into our lives in order to make us think of Him. Something to cause us to trust Him to get us through. We must remember that the things that are too hard for us, are <u>never</u> too hard for God. Both verses together talk about the power God used in creation. All of what are in the heavens and the earth, and all of how every created being has been designed and functions, is still a mystery to man today. If God made all these things in less than a week, then would not He be the one to go to when things get too hard for us?

In the book of Psalms and chapter 55, we find that King David was going through a tough time. When he wrote this psalm, he was dealing with a son that had turned the people against King David. David was now on the run from his son, and even one of his best friends had turned his back on David as well. This friend was supporting David's son, and not the King. For David things could have looked too hard. Things were not fair. King David was forced to leave his own kingdom after his own son had betrayed him, and his trusted friend had become disloyal. So, David writes this psalm and pours out his heart and feelings to the Lord. In verse 22 he writes "Cast thy burden upon the LORD, and he shall sustain thee: he shall never suffer the righteous to be moved". David knew that God could do what David could not. He just had to trust God to take care of things. As his last 6 words in that chapter says "...; but I will trust in thee." It is only God that can handle the things that are too hard for us. He has the power where we do not. He is the Creator; we are the creation.

Another story is that of Abraham and Sarah. Abraham was 99 and his wife, Sarah was 90 when they were told they would have a baby boy. This was incredibly hard to believe because of their age. So much that when Sarah heard it, she laughed in disbelief, to which God replied in Genesis 18:14 KJV "Is any thing too hard for the LORD? At the time appointed I will return unto thee, according to the time of life, and Sarah shall have a son." This thing that was too hard for Abraham and Sarah to accomplish, certainly was not too hard for God. The next time we are faced with a trial, a struggle, a difficulty that we may find too hard, may we pour out our heart to the Lord – to the one that doesn't see it like we do – too hard. Even better we don't have to wait until it gets too hard, but rather give it to the Lord earlier. Why get worn out trying to use our own strength to overcome, when we have God right there who would love to help his children. If God is our God, we can apply these verses into our life - "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble." (Psa 46:1 KJV) and "Casting all your care upon him; for he careth for you." (1 Peter 5:7 KJV) God is loving, and very able to do those things that are "too hard" for us – why not see if he can do what you cannot.

Nah 1:7 KJV - The LORD is good, a strong hold in the day of trouble; and he knoweth them that trust in him.
